Objective 4.1

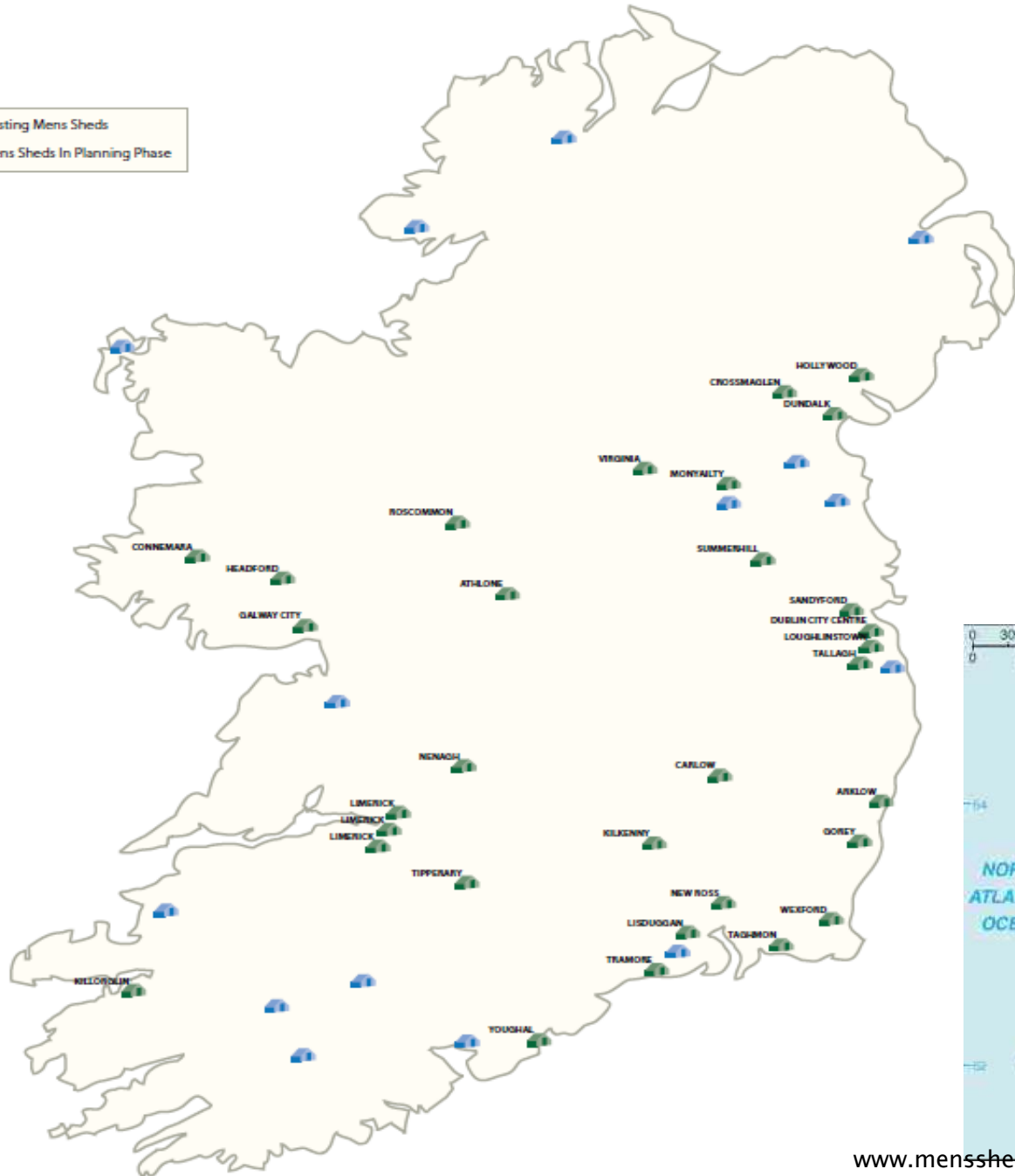

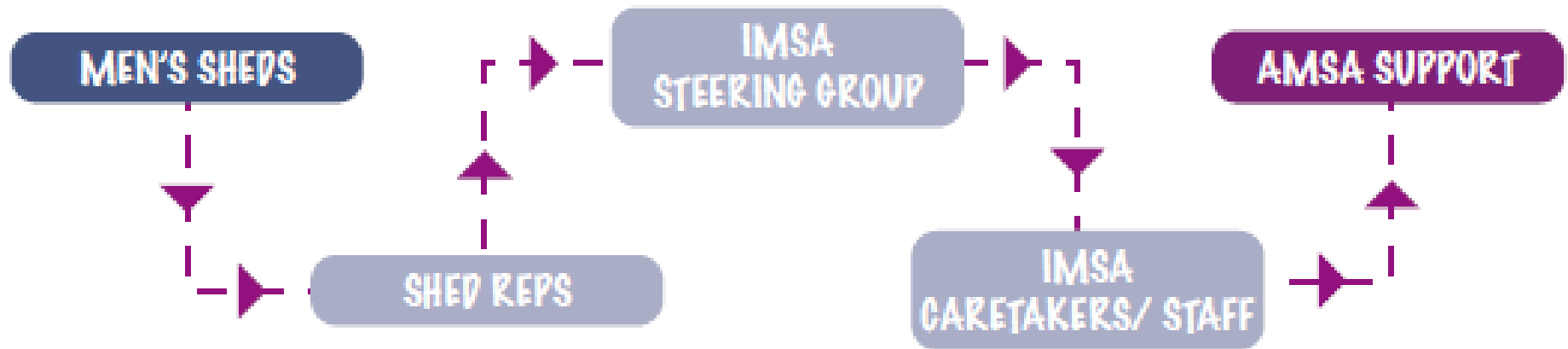

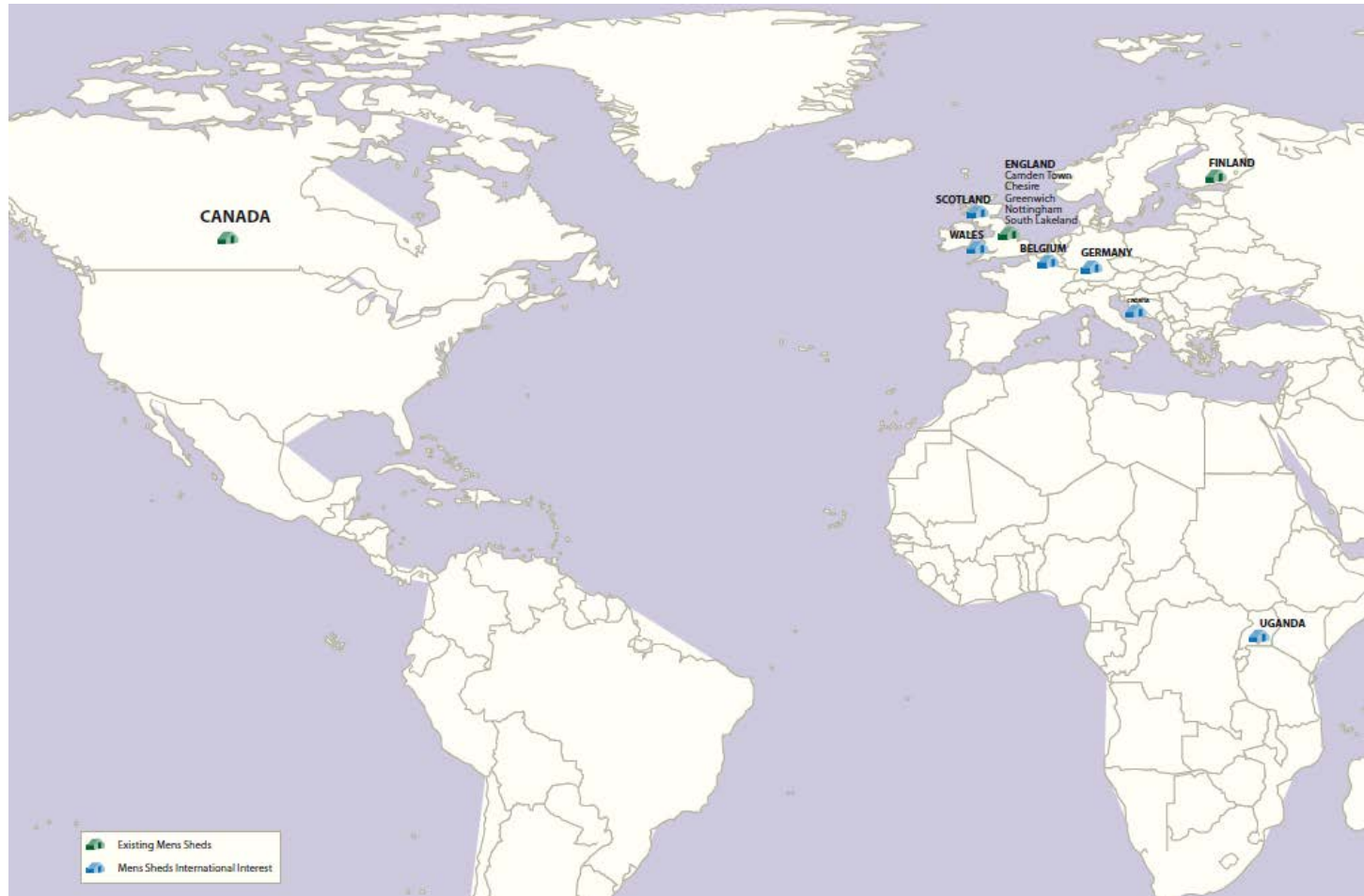
Organisational Structure

- ▶ AMSA European Representative
- ▶ AEMS: Alliance of European Men's Sheds
The **Aim** of AEMS is: to promote men's learning and well-being through Men's Sheds.

The **objectives** of AEMS are:

1. To influence decision makers, policy makers and funders by promoting Men's Sheds and their benefits.
2. To identify opportunities to extend access to learning and well-being to men.
3. To identify and source funding, where appropriate, to support the development of the Men's Sheds movement.
4. To share and celebrate best practice.
5. To build a strong and supportive Pan-European network of Men' Sheds.
6. To build an evidence base of knowledge via research and evaluations which will enhance the Men's Sheds movement.

How the Sheds can Spread!

Stage	Characteristics	Examples
4	Sheds are accepted and expected part and parcel of most communities	Australia
3	Growth in Shed Numbers; Concept becoming understood	New Zealand, UK, Ireland
2	First Sheds / Pilot Projects	Finland, Canada
1	First Contact /Expression of Interest	Belgium, Uganda, Croatia
0	Never heard of Men's Sheds	Chile, Ukraine, etc, etc
